Lorenzo M. Boyd, Ph.D., is a nationally recognized leader in police-community relations and an authority on urban policing, diversity issues in criminal justice, race and crime, and criminal justice systems.

A former president of the Academy of Criminal Justice Science and a life member of the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE), Dr. Boyd has appeared on local, regional, and national media outlets to discuss policing in the aftermath of high-profile cases.

Dr. Boyd currently serves as the University of New Haven's Vice President for Diversity and Inclusion and Chief Diversity Officer.

Tommy Norman is a Police Officer who has worked for the North Little Rock Police Department since 1998. Officer Norman has received national attention for his actions concerning the people in his community, specifically focusing on the youth.

Norman is known for positive community policing. He is credited for doing things like presenting 50 NLRSD students with backpacks and \$50 gift cards from Shoe Carnival to purchase shoes, starting the "Shop with a Cop" program to help financially struggling students or just dancing with the children.
