# The Joy Of Drawing <br> Made By: Joshua Nixon 

Players: Best played with 4-8 players.
Materials: The painting deck, pieces of paper, pencils, and coloring utensils (optional)
Instructions:

- Number each player (Example: if 4 players number each player 1-4)
- Every player needs to mark on their paper what number they are.
- Player 1 starts as Bob Ross and draws a painting card from the deck.
- Bob Ross will get 30 seconds to memorize the painting, after time is up they will lay the card face down.
- After such time they will spend the next 2:00 minutes trying to describe it to the group while they attempt to draw it. (if coloring change time to 2:30). Do not look at the painting card during the time. It is encouraged for Bob Ross to speak like Bob Ross during this time.
- Then everyone puts the drawings into the center, Bob Ross says something nice about everyone and writes down what he thinks is the closest. Note: Doing it in the Bob Ross voice makes it more enjoyable.
- After Bob Ross chooses a drawing and writes it down they keep it to themselves and reveal the painting card to the group.
- Bob Ross then reveals the original painting and the group decide on which one is the closest.
- The artist who gets the most votes gets a point, the artist who Bob Ross chose gets a point, if Bob Ross chose the same as the group Bob Ross gets a point. In the event of a group vote tie, everyone including Bob Ross gets a point.
- The game goes for as long as the group likes, whoever has the most points at the end wins. Usually, for short rounds, we recommend 5 points.
